### EXPLANATION:

This emergency order closes the resident and nonresident mountain goat hunting season in the South Baranof hunt zone in Game Management Unit 4. This emergency order takes effect at 11:59 PM, July 31, 2022.

### REGULATION:

Therefore, the provisions of **5 AAC 85.040, Hunting seasons and bag limits for goat**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

Unit 4, South Baranof - Drainages south of Gut Bay and the east branch of Great Arm Whale Bay and their respective inlet streams; and north of the divide between Larch Bay and Port Conclusion.	No open season (General hunt only)	No open season

1 goat by registration permit only, the taking  
of nannies with kids is prohibited.

All other mountain goat hunting regulations in Unit 4 remain unchanged and are not affected by this emergency order.

**JUSTIFICATION:**

Based on aerial surveys, the South Baranof hunt zone has historically had population levels too low to conduct a sustainable hunt. Mortality data from collared goats during the past three winters indicate that the goat population on Baranof Island has likely declined since the most recent surveys. Harvest in the South Baranof zone could result in over-utilization due to low population levels and accessibility.

Managers will re-assess and make in-season adjustments to hunt zone quotas and/or open and close zones when updated surveys are conducted in September.
