EXPLANATION: This emergency order provides sport fishing opportunity in the saltwater area near Hidden Falls to target hatchery king salmon returning to Hidden Falls Hatchery.

REGULATION: The provisions of 5 AAC 47.021(g)(10) are added by this emergency order. Under this emergency order the following provisions are effective 12:01 a.m. Wednesday, June 1 through 11:59 p.m. Tuesday, June 14, 2022:

5 AAC 47.021. Special provisions for seasons, bag, possession, annual, and size limits, and methods and means for the salt waters of Southeast Alaska Area.

(g) In the Sitka vicinity:

(10) the waters of Chatham Strait, within approximately 1.0 nmi of the Baranof Island shoreline south of the latitude of South Point at 57°16.28' N. lat., north of 57°06.76' N. lat., and west of a line from a point offshore at 57°16.28' N. lat., 134°49.94' W. long. to a point offshore at 57°06.76' N. lat., 134°45.37' W. long.,

- (A) the resident bag and possession limit is two king salmon, 28 inches or greater in length;
- (B) the nonresident bag and possession limit is one king salmon, 28 inches or greater in length;
- (C) the nonresident annual harvest limit is three king salmon, 28 inches or greater in length.

JUSTIFICATION: The waters of Chatham Strait are closed through June 14 to the retention of king salmon to protect Southeast Alaska wild stocks. However, the expected total return of hatchery king salmon to Hidden Falls Hatchery in 2022 is 500 fish, none of which are needed for broodstock. This opening will allow opportunity for anglers to retain hatchery king salmon within the Hidden Falls Terminal Harvest Area.

PREVIOUS EMERGENCY ORDERS AFFECTED: Emergency Order 1-KS-R-05-22 established resident and nonresident king salmon bag and possession limits and a nonresident king salmon annual limit as per the Southeast Alaska King Salmon Management plan based on the 2021 winter troll catch per unit effort and remains in effect in the area outside those described in this emergency order.

Emergency Order 1-KS-R-06-22 establishes areas and times when king salmon may not be retained in the vicinity of Haines, Skagway, Juneau, Sitka, Petersburg, Wrangell and Ketchikan. These actions were taken to reduce the harvest of Southeast Alaska wild king salmon stocks and meet objectives for king salmon management within the Pacific Salmon Treaty and are not affected by this emergency order.
