## *Emergency Order*

### EXPLANATION:

This emergency order closes the Kenai River to fishing for king salmon and prohibits the use of bait and multiple hooks in the Kenai River from its mouth upstream to ADF&G markers located at the outlet of Skilak Lake from 12:01 a.m. Friday, June 20 through 11:59 p.m. Friday, August 15, 2025. This closure prohibits all sport fishing for king salmon, including catch-and-release fishing. King salmon may not be retained or possessed; king salmon caught while fishing for other species may not be removed from the water and must be released immediately.

### REGULATION:

The provisions of 5 AAC 57.120(a)(2)(A) and (a)(3)(A), and 5 AAC 57.121(1)(B) are superseded by this emergency order. The following provisions are effective 12:01 a.m. Friday, June 20 through 11:59 p.m. Friday, August 15, 2025:

#### **5 AAC 57.120. General provisions for seasons, bag, possession, annual, and size limits, and methods and means for the Kenai River Drainage Area.**

(a)(2) king salmon 20 inches or greater in length, as follows:

(A) from June 20 – August 15, the Kenai River from its mouth upstream to an ADF&G regulatory marker located at the outlet of Skilak Lake, is closed to sport fishing for king salmon; king salmon may not be retained or possessed; king salmon may not be removed from the water and must be released immediately;

(a)(3) king salmon less than 20 inches in length, as follows:

(A) from June 20 – August 15, flowing waters and unstocked lakes and ponds and the Kenai River from its mouth upstream to ADF&G markers located at the outlet of Skilak Lake, are closed to sport fishing for king salmon; king salmon may not be retained or possessed; king salmon may not be removed from the water and must be released immediately;

#### **5 AAC 57.121. Special provisions for the seasons, bag, possession, and size limits, and methods and means for the Lower Section of the Kenai River Drainage Area.**

(1) sport fishing gear restrictions:

(B) from June 20 – August 15, in the Kenai River from its mouth upstream to an ADF&G regulatory marker located approximately 300 yards downstream from the outlet of Skilak Lake, only one unbaited, single-hook, artificial lure may be used;

**JUSTIFICATION:**

The *Kenai River late-run king salmon stock of concern management plan* (5 AAC 21.382) directs the department to manage to achieve the recovery escapement goal of late-run king salmon into the Kenai River system. The recovery escapement goal for late-run Kenai River king salmon is 14,250 – 30,000 king salmon 75 cm mid eye to tail fork and longer.

Kenai River king salmon and other king salmon stocks throughout Cook Inlet are experiencing a period of low productivity and below average run strength. The 2025 forecast for the stock of large ( $\geq 75$  cm mid-eye-to-tail-fork-length [METF] or approximately  $\geq 34$  inches in total length) late-run king salmon in the Kenai River is 8,742 fish. This total run forecast is below the recovery escapement goal range of 14,250 – 30,000 fish. There is an 80% chance the total run will be between 4,526 to 16,883 fish. This prediction interval is wide and indicates a 20% chance the total run could be outside the prediction interval. The forecast is well below the 20-year average run of approximately 25,960 fish and still lower than the recent 5-year (2020–2024) average total run of approximately 12,100 large fish. If realized, this forecast would be the 2<sup>nd</sup> lowest run in the past five years and rank as the 2<sup>nd</sup> lowest on record. Closing the late-run king salmon sport fishery preseason is warranted until data from inseason assessment projects indicate that fishing opportunity can be afforded without jeopardizing the achievement of the recovery escapement goal.
