ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME Region I (Southeast Alaska)

At the request of the Board of Game, the Department of Fish and Game will review all Required Permit Hunt Conditions authorized by 5 AAC 92.050 for all hunts in Region I (Southeast Alaska). The delegated authorities of 5 AAC 92.050 are listed in Proposal 45. The following pages contain permit hunt requirement for the 29 permit hunts that currently exist in Region I.

Hunt Name provides the general hunt locations, and in some cases additional information on hunt location is provided in the Additional Requirement section. In other cases it may be necessary to use the hunt number to refer descriptions found in the Alaska Hunting Regulations.
