2020 SOUTHEAST ALASKA DIRECTED BLACK ROCKFISH FISHERY UPDATE

Petersburg . . . The Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) announced today the following information regarding the Southeast Alaska directed black rockfish fishery.

Federal rockfish landing requirements

Effective March 23, 2020, federal regulations require that the operator of a federally-permitted catcher vessel using hook and line, pot, or jig gear in the exclusive economic zone (EEZ) of the Gulf of Alaska **retain and land all rockfish caught** while fishing for groundfish or halibut. Vessels participating in the directed black rockfish fishery in the EEZ are required to retain and land all rockfish; therefore, they must possess a Federal Fisheries Permit.

Groundfish bycatch allowances for the directed black rockfish fishery

Allowable bycatch limits for rockfish have been adjusted to facilitate consistency between state and federal regulations and are **effective for state waters and state managed groundfish taken in federal waters on March 14, 2020** (5 AAC 28.070 (b)). All rockfish in excess of allowable bycatch limits shall be reported as bycatch overage on an ADF&G fish ticket. Rockfish bycatch overage from state waters, in excess of legal limits, may be retained for personal use or sold; however, all proceeds from the sale of excess rockfish bycatch must be forfeited to the State of Alaska. Excess rockfish bycatch taken in federal waters may be retained for personal use or donated but may not enter commerce. The demersal shelf rockfish (DSR) assemblage includes yelloweye, quillback, canary, copper, tiger, China, and rosethorn rockfish.

A permit holder who is directed fishing for black rockfish in waters of Alaska (0–3 nm) in the Southeast District may retain and sell the following bycatch percentages, based on the round weight of black rockfish on board.
