KODIAK COMMERCIAL HERRING SAC ROE FISHERY ADVISORY ANNOUNCEMENT #15 For Emergency Order #4-FH-K-15-20

The *R/V K-Hi-C* will now be conducting surveys in the **combined Village Islands/Uganik sections (UG30,32,33, and 34)**. If test fishing detects fishable quantities of quality fish, commercial fishing may begin as soon as **4:30 p.m. Tuesday, April 14**. Herring fishermen interested conducting test sets should contact the *R/V K-Hi-C* on the fishing grounds (VHF channel 6 or Sat dispatch 7412).

As Previously Announced:

Commercial herring fishing **opened** for purse seine gear in that portion of the **Terror Bay Section (UG21) south of a line 57° 55.00' N. lat., and north of a line 57° 46.00' N. lat., at noon Monday, April 13.**

The **Terror Bay Section (UG21)** of the **Uganik District** **closed** to commercial herring fishing for the remainder of the 2020 Kodiak herring sac roe season at **12:50 p.m. Monday, April 13, 2020.**

The *R/V Resolution* is now done for the 2020 Kodiak sac roe herring season and will now return to the city of Kodiak. So far this season, approximately 1,500 tons of herring have been harvested in the Kodiak Area.

The following areas are **closed** for the remainder of the 2020 Kodiak herring sac roe season:

- (EA22) Newman Bay;
- (EA24) Barling Bay;
- (EA31) Tanginak Anchorage;
- (EA43) Outer Kiliuda Bay;
- (AL60) Geese-Twoheaded; and
- (NE10) Womens Bay.
- (EA20) SW Sitkalidak;
- (EA23) West Sitkalidak;
- (EA30) East Sitkalidak;
- (EA42) Shearwater Bay;
- (EA44) Inner Kiliuda Bay;
- (NE20) Kalsin Bay

All herring **permit holders**, buyers and tender operators participating are **required to register** with the ADF&G Kodiak office or with ADF&G personnel on the grounds prior to operations.

FISHING PERIODS:

PURSE SEINE: Fishing periods for purse seine gear will be noon to 9:00 p.m. on odd-numbered days and 9:00 a.m. to noon on even-numbered days. **GILLNET:** Gillnet fishing periods will be noon on even-numbered days to noon on odd-numbered days starting April 2.

EMERGENCY ORDER (EO) AREAS

These sections will be actively managed for roe quality and size of herring by the ADF&G management biologist aboard the R/V *K-Hi-C* or R/V *Resolution*. There will be at least 24-hour notice prior to any potential fishing period. ADF&G will attempt to target approximately 140 gram or larger herring with approximately 11% roe recovery on the grounds. Permit holders wishing to fish in these sections are urged to contact the management biologist to volunteer for test fishing and discuss how the fishery will be managed. Purse seine permit holders will be given the first opportunity to fish after permit holders have detected harvestable quantities of quality fish.

GHLs and maps of open sections are available at the Kodiak office and in the herring sac roe fishery harvest strategy for the 2020 season. Fishermen are urged to check with their market and test their catch prior to landing herring. Determining if size or roe quality meets processor standards is the responsibility of fishermen and industry. It is anticipated that many small and green fish will be present on the grounds during the initial open fishing periods.
