KODIAK COMMERCIAL HERRING SAC ROE FISHERY ADVISORY ANNOUNCEMENT #38 For Emergency Orders #4-FH-K-38-20

The Spiridon Bay (UY 50) and Zachar Bay (UY40) sections of the Uyak District will be combined and managed as one section beginning noon Sunday, May 3 and follow the fishing periods as described in regulation. The Guideline Harvest Level (GHL) for the combined Zachar Bay and Spiridon Bay sections (UY40,50) will be 350 tons.

So far this season, approximately 3,900 tons of herring have been harvested in the Kodiak Area.

GHLs and maps of open sections are available at the Kodiak office and in the herring sac roe fishery harvest strategy for the 2020 season. Fishermen are urged to check with their market and test their catch prior to landing herring. Determining if size or roe quality meets processor standards is the responsibility of fishermen and industry. It is anticipated that many small and green fish will be present on the grounds during the initial open fishing periods.
