Prince William Sound Salmon Fishery Announcement #13

<u>COPPER RIVER DISTRICT</u>: The Copper River District will remain closed to commercial fishing. Permit holders are advised that the Copper River commercial fishery may open on short notice should indices of sockeye salmon abundance support fishing. A minimum of 17 hours advance notice of a fishery opening is anticipated. The Copper River District will open to subsistence fishing at 7:00 am on Monday, June 22 for a 12-hour fishing period. Waters within the Chinook salmon inside closure area will be **OPEN** during this subsistence fishing period.

The grass bank marker line is defined in 5AAC 24.350(1)(A) with the exception of this year's extension of the closure line across Little Softuk (**see bold font below**). This closure line is defined with the following points:

Waters north of this line, within sloughs, and in Boswell Bay within the bay (5 AAC 24.350 (1)(A)) are closed to commercial and subsistence salmon fishing <u>during all periods</u>.

During the commercial fishing season, subsistence harvest may occur in the Copper River District concurrent in time and area with commercial fishing periods until the Copper River District is closed at the end of the season. Additionally, waters of the Copper River District, including the Chinook salmon inside closure area, will be <u>OPEN</u> to subsistence fishing from 6:00 am to 10:00 pm on Saturday, June 27. Subsistence users may obtain subsistence permits during regular business hours. The Cordova ADF&G office is open to the public Monday - Friday, 8:00 am - 12:00 pm and 1:00 pm - 5:00 pm. <u>Subsistence permits are not available outside of regular office hours.</u> Permit holders are encouraged to call the Cordova office at 907-424-3212 or report online (https://www.adfg.alaska.gov/Harvest/) to provide preliminary harvest reports to assist with inseason harvest tracking.

To date, the sonar count is the 15th lowest on record (1978-2020). Cumulative commercial harvest this year is the 4^{th} lowest harvest to-date in the last 50 years. Cumulative sonar count through 6/19 is 294,034 fish whereas 376,410 fish are projected by this date. The 0600 count for 6/20 is 2,034 fish.

BERING RIVER DISTRICT: The Bering River District will remain closed to commercial fishing.

<u>COGHILL DISTRICT</u>: The Coghill District, excluding waters of the Esther and Granite Bay subdistricts and waters of the WNH SHA and THA, will open to commercial drift gillnet harvest for a 24-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Monday, June 22. This fishing period may be extended if wild stock abundance indices warrant additional fishing opportunity. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 36-hour period that started on Thursday, June 18 were 12,200 chum and 8,500 sockeye salmon with 259 deliveries reported. As of June 19, 1,957 sockeye salmon had passed the Coghill River weir versus a minimum cumulative anticipated of 937 fish.

PWSAC cost recovery remains on hold due to slow chum salmon run entry into the Coghill District. **In response to COVID-19, all PWSAC facilities are closed to the public until further notice.**

ESHAMY DISTRICT: The Eshamy District, **excluding waters of the Main Bay Subdistrict and the MBH AGZ, SHA, and THA,** will open to commercial gillnet harvest for a 24-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Monday, June 22. This fishing period may be extended if enhanced sockeye salmon abundance indices warrant additional fishing opportunity. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 36-hour period that started on Thursday, June 18 were 57,800 sockeye and 7,400 chum salmon with 612 deliveries reported.

In order to facilitate cost recovery harvests and broodstock collection, PWSAC recommends that all waters within the Main Bay Subdistrict are closed for the commercial fishing period commencing Monday, June 22. PWSAC's cost recovery program at MBH began on Thursday, June 18. To date, PWSAC has collected less than 6% of the assigned sockeye salmon revenue goal. In response to COVID-19, all PWSAC facilities are closed to the public until further notice.

<u>UNAKWIK DISTRICT</u>: The Unakwik District will open to commercial drift gillnet and purse seine harvest for a 24-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Monday, June 22.

MONTAGUE DISTRICT: The Port Chalmers Subdistrict, **north of 60°12.56' N. lat. and east a line from 60° 12.56'N., 147° 20.25'W. to 60° 20.00'N., 147° 14.30'W.,** will open to purse seine fishing for **48-hours** beginning at 8:00 am on Monday, June 22. A regular schedule of three fishing periods per week is anticipated to remain in effect until further notice. **Regulatory closed waters and anadromous stream closures within the Port Chalmers Subdistrict will not be in effect until further notice.** Preliminary harvest estimates from the 36-hour period that started on Thursday, June 18 were 82,200 chum salmon with 55 deliveries reported.

SOUTHWESTERN DISTRICT: The AFK Hatchery THA and SHA will open to purse seine fishing for **48-hours** beginning at 8:00 am on Monday, June 22. A regular schedule of two fishing periods per week is anticipated to remain in effect until further notice. **Anadromous stream closures within the AFK Hatchery THA and SHA will not be in effect until further notice.** Preliminary harvest estimates from the 48-hour period that started on Monday, June 15 were 18,744 chum and 402 sockeye salmon with 31 deliveries reported.

In response to COVID-19, all PWSAC facilities are closed to the public until further notice.

Unless otherwise specified, all openings are clock openings based on Alaska Daylight Time, which is based on Coordinated Universal Time and may be obtained by calling 303-499-7111.

The department encourages commercial permit holders to renew their licenses early and to check their CFEC vessel registration stickers to make sure they are current. The department also encourages permit holders to report observed violations to Wildlife Safeguard at 800-478-3377. Reports are anonymous and cash rewards may be paid for successful prosecution of violations.
