Prince William Sound Salmon Fishery Announcement #19

<u>COPPER RIVER DISTRICT</u>: The Copper River District will remain closed to commercial fishing. Permit holders are advised that the Copper River commercial fishery may open on short notice should indices of sockeye salmon abundance support fishing. A minimum of 17 hours advance notice of a fishery opening is anticipated. The Copper River District will open to subsistence fishing at 7:00 am on Thursday, July 9 for a 12-hour fishing period.

The grass bank marker line is defined in 5AAC 24.350(1)(A) with the exception of this year's extension of the closure line across Little Softuk (**see bold font below**). This closure line is defined with the following points:

Waters north of this line, within sloughs, and in Boswell Bay within the bay (5 AAC 24.350 (1)(A)) are closed to commercial and subsistence salmon fishing <u>during all periods</u>.

During the commercial fishing season, subsistence harvest may occur in the Copper River District concurrent in time and area with commercial fishing periods until the Copper River District is closed at the end of the season. Additionally, waters of the Copper River District will <u>OPEN</u> to subsistence fishing from 6:00 am to 10:00 pm on Saturday, July 11. Subsistence users may obtain subsistence permits during regular business hours. The Cordova ADF&G office is open to the public Monday - Friday, 8:00 am - 12:00 pm and 1:00 pm - 5:00 pm. <u>Subsistence permits are not available outside of regular office hours.</u> Permit holders are encouraged to call the Cordova office at 907-424-3212 or report online (https://www.adfg.alaska.gov/Harvest/) to provide preliminary harvest reports to assist with inseason harvest tracking.

To date, the sonar count is the 15th lowest on record (1978-2020). Cumulative commercial harvest this year is the 4^{th} lowest harvest to-date in the last 50 years. Cumulative sonar count through 7/7 is 441,931 fish whereas 497,633

fish are projected by this date. The 0600 count for 7/8 is 1,214 fish. For the week ending July 4, the Copper River Delta survey count was 28,320 sockeye salmon versus an anticipated range of 28,229 - 66,722.

BERING RIVER DISTRICT: The Bering River District will remain closed to commercial fishing.

<u>COGHILL DISTRICT</u>: The Coghill District, excluding waters of the Esther, Granite Bay, and **Bettles Bay** subdistricts and waters of the WNH SHA and THA, will open to commercial drift gillnet harvest for a 24-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Thursday, July 9. **Waters of Port Wells and College Fiord, north of 60° 55.81' N., and east of a line from Pakenham Point (61° 00.45' N., 148° 04.85' W.) to 60° 55.81' N., 148° 10.92' W., will open to commercial drift gillnet harvest for an 84-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Thursday, July 9. Regulatory closed waters pertaining to the Coghill River, as specified in 5 AAC 24.350(6)(B))**, will not be in effect during this fishing period. Commercial fishing will not be permitted within the bed or channel of the Coghill River at any stage of the tide. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 60-hour period that started on Monday, July 6 are not yet available. As of July 7, 28,533 sockeye salmon have passed the Coghill River weir versus a cumulative anticipated range of 11,276– 33,827 fish.

PWSAC recommends that the Esther Subdistrict, Granite Bay Subdistrict and the WNH THA and SHA remain closed for the commercial fishing period commencing Thursday, July 9. In response to COVID-19, all PWSAC facilities are closed to the public until further notice.

ESHAMY DISTRICT: The Eshamy District, **excluding** the MBH THA, SHA and AGZ, will open to commercial gillnet harvest for a 24-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Thursday, July 9. The Eshamy District, **including** the MBH THA, SHA and AGZ, will open to commercial gillnet harvest for a 12-hour period starting at 8:00 am on Friday, July 10. The MBH AGZ will open to SET GILLNET permit holders only during this fishing period. Regulatory closed waters in the Main Bay Subdistrict and MBH THA, SHA, and AGZ, will not be in effect from 8:00 am, Thursday, July 9 to 8:00 am, Saturday, July 11.

PWSAC anticipates concluding MBH cost recovery by the end of the day on Thursday and has secured their broodstock; therefore, PWSAC recommends a stepwise approach to moving the fishery in to the Main Bay Subdistrict and hatchery terminal areas to facilitate a clean-up of any built-up enhanced sockeye salmon. In response to COVID-19, all PWSAC facilities are closed to the public until further notice.

<u>UNAKWIK DISTRICT</u>: The Unakwik District will **remain closed** to commercial drift gillnet and purse seine harvest.

SEINE FISHERIES: VFDA began its cost recovery sales program on Monday, July 6 and has collected approximately 12.76% of the assigned pink salmon revenue goal through July 8. VFDA reports that cost recovery pink salmon harvest in Port Valdez on Tuesday, July 7 resulted in an average weight of 3.79 pounds per fish and 12.5% female. VFDA cost recovery is continuing today. Permit holders are advised that there will be a minimum of 24-hours advance notice for a fishery targeting VFDA pink salmon.

An aerial survey of the Eastern and Northern districts was conducted on Tuesday, June 30. Stream escapement observations were minimal during these surveys, which is to be expected for the date. The next aerial survey of the Eastern and Northern districts is expected to occur Thursday, July 9.

MONTAGUE DISTRICT: The Port Chalmers Subdistrict, **north of 60°12.56' N. lat. and east a line from 60° 12.56'N., 147° 20.25'W. to 60° 20.00'N., 147° 14.30'W.,** will open to purse seine fishing for **36-hours** beginning at 8:00 am on Thursday, July 9 and for **36-hours** beginning at 8:00 am on Saturday, July 11. A regular schedule of three fishing periods per week is anticipated to remain in effect until further notice. **Regulatory closed waters** and anadromous stream closures within the Port Chalmers Subdistrict will not be in effect until further notice. Preliminary harvest estimates from the 36-hour period that started on Saturday, July 4 were 16,836 chum salmon with 35 deliveries reported.

SOUTHWESTERN DISTRICT: The AFK Hatchery THA and SHA will open to purse seine fishing for **24-hours** beginning at 8:00 am on Thursday, July 9 and for **24-hours** beginning at 8:00 am on Saturday, July 11. A regular schedule of three fishing periods per week is anticipated to remain in effect until further notice. **Anadromous stream closures within the AFK Hatchery THA and SHA will not be in effect until further notice.** Preliminary harvest estimates from the 24-hour period that started on Monday, July 6 were 2,600 chum and 400 sockeye salmon with 9 deliveries reported.

In response to COVID-19, all PWSAC facilities are closed to the public until further notice.

Unless otherwise specified, all openings are clock openings based on Alaska Daylight Time, which is based on Coordinated Universal Time and may be obtained by calling 303-499-7111.

The department encourages commercial permit holders to renew their licenses early and to check their CFEC vessel registration stickers to make sure they are current. The department also encourages permit holders to report observed violations to Wildlife Safeguard at 800-478-3377. Reports are anonymous and cash rewards may be paid for successful prosecution of violations.
