KODIAK COMMERCIAL SALMON FISHERY ADVISORY ANNOUNCEMENT #26 For Emergency Order #4-FS-K-26-20

Special Note: Department's 24-hour record-a-phone at 486-4559 is temporarily out of service and we hope to fix it early next week.

There will be a <u>45-hour extension</u> to the current commercial salmon fishing period from 9:00 p.m. Sunday, August 16 to 6:00 p.m. Tuesday, August 18 in the following areas:

- The Seven Rivers and Two-Headed sections of the Eastside Kodiak District south of a latitude of <u>Cape Kiavak</u> (57° 00.00 N. lat.).

As Previously Announced:

There will be a <u>54-hour</u> commercial salmon fishing period from **noon Sunday**, August 16 to 6:00 p.m. Tuesday, August 18 in the following areas:

- The Sharatin Bay and Kizhuyak Bay sections of the Northwest Kodiak District;
- The Shuyak Island and Pauls Bay sections of the Afognak District;
- The **Big River**, **Hallo Bay**, **Outer Kukak Bay**, **Dakavak Bay** and **Katmai sections** of the **Mainland District**; and
- The Alinchak Bay Section of the Mainland District north of the latitude of <u>Cape Kekernoi</u> (57° 43.50' N lat.).

The following areas will <u>close</u> to commercial salmon fishing at **9:00 p.m. Sunday**, August 16:

- The Cape Alitak, Alitak Bay, Moser Bay, and Olga Bay sections of the Alitak District;
- The Inner Ugak Bay, Outer Ugak Bay, Sitkalidak, and Two-Headed sections of the Eastside Kodiak District north of a latitude of <u>Cape Kiavak</u> (57° 00.00 N. lat.);
- The **Duck Bay Section** of the **Afognak District**; and
- The Spiridon Bay Special Harvest Area (Telrod Cove).

There will be a <u>45-hour extension</u> to the current commercial salmon fishing period from 9:00 p.m. Sunday, August 16 to 6:00 p.m. Tuesday, August 18 in the following areas:

- The Outer Karluk and Outer Ayakulik sections of the Southwest Kodiak District;
- The **Northwest Kodiak District** (except the Anton Larsen Bay, Zachar Bay, Spiridon Bay, and Uyak Bay sections will remain closed);
- The Humpy Deadman and Dog Salmon Flats sections of the Alitak District;
- The Southeast Afognak, Raspberry Strait, Southwest Afognak, Northwest Afognak, Perenosa Bay, and Northeast Afognak sections of the Afognak District; and

- The Northeast Kodiak District.

Closed Water Adjustments:

Closed waters are <u>reduced</u> in the **Dog Salmon Flats Section** of the **Alitak District** until to **6:00 p.m. Tuesday**, **August 18** to the ADF&G markers located at the stream terminus of **Dog Salmon Creek** (stream #257-403).

Closed waters are <u>reduced</u> in the **Dog Salmon Flats Section** of the **Alitak District** from **9:00 p.m. Sunday**, **August 16 until** to **6:00 p.m. Tuesday**, **August 18** to <u>Horse Marine Lagoon's</u> exit channel terminus at the ocean shoreline (stream #257-402)

<u>Until further notice</u>, in that portion of the Northwest Kodiak and Southwest Kodiak districts south of the latitude of Cape Kuliuk, Chinook (king) salmon 28 inches or greater in length may not be retained by purse seine gear in the commercial salmon fishery and must be returned to the water unharmed.

Other closed waters are as shown on the Kodiak Area Salmon Statistical Chart and detailed in the Commercial Salmon Fishing Regulations (5AAC 18.350). Statistical Charts, Harvest Strategies, and Commercial Salmon Fishing Regulations are available at the Kodiak Fish and Game office.
