2020/21 Kodiak, Chignik, and South Peninsula District Red Sea Cucumber Guideline Harvest Levels and Fishery Information

The Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) has established guideline harvest levels (GHLs) for the 2020/21 commercial red sea cucumber season in the Kodiak, Chignik, and South Peninsula districts. Guideline harvest levels are based on historical fishery performance and harvest data, and are as follows:

The 2020/21 red sea cucumber season opens by regulation September 15, 2020 in the Chignik District and October 1, 2020 in the Kodiak and South Peninsula districts, however fishing may only occur during fishing periods which ADF&G will establish by emergency order and announce in subsequent advisory announcements. ADF&G will assess distribution of effort and fishery performance throughout the 2020/21 season. Poor fishery performance may result in district or section closures prior to achieving the full GHL.

Prior to fishing, each diver is required to obtain a current sea cucumber dive gear interim-use permit card from the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission (CFEC) and a valid diver registration or commissioner permit from ADF&G. Divers must secure a market prior to harvesting sea cucumbers. Participation in the Kodiak District

fishery requires a different CFEC interim-use permit card (Q11K) than is required in the Chignik and South Peninsula districts fisheries (Q11B). All divers are required to submit completed logbooks to ADF&G after each fishing period. Due to health concerns related to COVID-19, divers are encouraged obtain registration forms, commissioner permits, and logbooks by mail, email (nathaniel.nichols@alaska.gov) or fax (907-486-1824), however all fishery related documents are also available in-person at the ADF&G office in Kodiak.
