2024 Yukon River Salmon Fall Fishery Announcement #13 District 6 Subsistence Fishing Schedule

Districts Affected: Upper Yukon Area

The 2024 Yukon River fall chum and coho salmon runs are projected to be one of the lowest on record (1974–2023). The fall chum salmon run is projected to be 150,000-200,000 fish compared to a historical run size of 900,000 fish. The coho salmon run size is projected to be 28,000-44,000 fish compared to a historical average run index of 220,000 fish. Due to the extremely poor salmon runs, subsistence fishing for coho salmon will close and nonsalmon subsistence fishing with 4-inch gillnets is being reduced to protect migrating salmon.

Subsistence Management Actions

Subdistricts 6-A and 6-B (from the mouth of the Tanana River upstream to the Wood River, including Manley, Old Minto area, and Nenana):

Subsistence fishing is open with dip nets, beach seines, and manned fish wheels for nonsalmon and pink, sockeye, and coho salmon. Chum and Chinook salmon remain closed and must be released alive immediately from these gear types. Subsistence fishing for nonsalmon with 4-inch or smaller mesh set gillnets are limited to 60 feet or shorter length.

Effective 12:01 a.m. on Monday, August 26, subsistence fishing for coho salmon will close and fishing with 4-inch or smaller mesh gillnets for nonsalmon will only be allowed from 12:01 am Fridays through 11:59 p.m. Sundays. All gillnets will be closed Mondays through Thursdays likely for the remainder of the salmon season.

In Lake Minchumina and the Tolovana River drainage, including Minto Flats, subsistence fishing for nonsalmon will remain open 24 hours a day, seven days per week with 6-inch or smaller mesh gillnets.

A subsistence permit is required to fish for salmon in Subdistricts 6-A and 6-B including the Kantishna River drainage and for northern pike in the Tolovana River drainage, including Minto Flats.

Upper Tanana Area (the Tanana River from the confluence with the mouth of Volkmar River on the north bank and the mouth of the Johnson River on the south bank upstream to the Tanana River headwaters, including Delta Junction area, Dot Lake, Tanacross, Tetlin, Tok, Northway, and Nabesna):

Subsistence fishing is open with dip nets, beach seines, and manned fish wheels for nonsalmon and pink, sockeye, and coho salmon. Chum and Chinook salmon remain closed and must be released alive immediately from these gear types. Subsistence fishing for nonsalmon with 4-inch or smaller mesh set gillnets are limited to 60 feet or shorter length. See next action on page 2.

Effective 12:01 a.m. on Monday, August 26, subsistence fishing for coho salmon will close and fishing with 4-inch or smaller mesh gillnets for nonsalmon will only be allowed from 12:01 am Fridays through 11:59 p.m. Sundays. All gillnets will be closed Mondays through Thursdays likely for the remainder of the salmon season. There will be an announcement in late October when restrictions are relaxed.

A subsistence fishing permit is required for all species in the Upper Tanana Area.

Nonsalmon Subsistence Fishing

Fishermen should use nonsalmon gear in areas where resident species are more likely to be encountered. Other legal gear types to take nonsalmon include hand line, longline, fyke net, and spear. If closures are in place for a salmon species, they must be released alive immediately from these gear types.

Federal Special Action

ADF&G and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) have coordinated on this advisory announcement. The USFWS Federal Inseason Manager has issued a separate Federal special action FSA 2-FC-06-24 with the same fishing schedule that restricts fishing to federally qualified subsistence users in waters adjacent to Federal Land.
