Advisory Announcement

Aleutian Islands State-Waters Sablefish 2025 Guideline Harvest Level

The 2025 Aleutian Islands state-waters sablefish fishery guideline harvest level (GHL) is 2,730,000 pounds. The statewaters sablefish season in the Aleutian Islands will open and close with the adjacent federal individual fishing quota (IFQ) sablefish season. Season dates will be announced via an advisory announcement once the IFQ season dates are set.

The Aleutian Islands state-waters sablefish registration area includes all state waters west of Scotch Cap Light (164° 44.72'W longitude) and south of Cape Sarichef (54° 36'N latitude). All vessels harvesting sablefish in state waters, including those participating in federal IFQ or Community Development Quota (CDQ) sablefish fisheries, <u>must</u> register for the state-waters sablefish fishery.

Pot, longline, jig, and hand troll are the only legal gear types. Pot gear may be longlined in the Aleutian Islands District and Western District of the South Peninsula Area.

Fishermen are required to submit a state-waters sablefish logbook to the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) Dutch Harbor office within 7 days of each landing. Fishermen delivering east of Scotch Cap Light must check out of the state-waters sablefish registration area by contacting ADF&G in Dutch Harbor before departing the registration area and may be required to submit to an inspection at a point designated by the local representative of the department.

Sablefish may be taken as bycatch in state waters of the Aleutian Islands District and the Western District of the South Alaska Peninsula Area. Bycatch may not exceed 1% by weight of the directed groundfish species and directed halibut on board a vessel. All vessels retaining sablefish, even as a bycatch species, must obtain a 2025 interim-use permit card for sablefish from the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission.
