How Project WILD Came To Be...

Project WILD was developed through a joint effort of the Western Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies (WAFWA) and the Western Regional Environmental Education Council, Inc. (WREEC). WREEC has become the Council for Environmental Education (CEE). Project WILD is sponsored by each state, primarily through wildlife and conservation agencies. It is also an international program.

Alaska Project WILD

In Alaska, Project WILD is funded by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game The Division of Wildlife Conservation administers Project WILD. Since 1983, Alaska Project WILD has trained over 5,000 educators state-wide in conservation education.
