

General Rules for Use of Rabbit Creek Shooting Park

A person may not use a state-owned shooting facility until that person acknowledges and agrees to the general rules and conditions for use posted at the facility.

A person using this shooting facility shall:

- 1) keep all firearms, bow and arrows, and crossbows pointed in a safe direction;
- 2) not touch the trigger of a firearm or crossbow unless ready to shoot;
- 3) keep all firearms, bows and arrows, and crossbows unloaded until ready to use;
- 4) wear appropriate eye and ear protection at all times while on or near the firing line(s);
- 5) follow all instructions of a range master or safety officer;
- 6) shoot only at authorized targets (no exploding, mobile, glass, cans or other items considered trash targets);
- 7) use only authorized ammunition (no tracer, incendiary, or explosive/cracker rounds);
- 8) cease fire upon command;
- 9) act in a safe and orderly manner; and
- 10) not use or be under the influence of alcohol or drugs, except for lawful medicines.
- 11)
 - a. When a CEASE FIRE is called, or when transporting an uncased firearm, all actions must be open and empty of all ammunition.
 - b. During a CEASE FIRE, do not touch any firearm or anything on the shooting bench.
 - c. Only during a LIVE FIRE may uncased firearms be carried to or removed from the firing line.
- 12) Anyone may call a CEASE FIRE at any time if they feel that there is a safety concern on the range.

ADDITIONAL RANGE RULES

- 13) When not in use, firearms should be placed on the shooting bench, in a case, or in an appropriate firearm rack.
- 14) Firearms may be loaded with no more than ten rounds at a time.
- 15) No holster draw, movement drills, or trick shooting is permitted on the public ranges.
- 16) Pets must remain in vehicles.
- 17) If using any Muzzleloader or Black powder firearm, you must establish a loading station well behind the firing line. No containers of black powder or black powder substitute are allowed on or near the shooting benches.
- 18) You and your group will be refused admission if we believe you, or any member of your group, is in any way impaired or may pose a hazard to others. We reserve the right to refuse service to anyone at any time.
- 19) You will be asked to leave the range if you do not obey the range rules, are using an unsafe firearm, or are not conducting yourself in a safe, sportsman-like manner, as determined by any of our range personnel. Repeated offenses may be cause for permanent ejection at the sole discretion of the range staff on duty.
- 20) Shooters under the age of 16 must have adult supervision at all times.
