- Cancellation Policy: Read Carefully! When you submit your registration form you are agreeing to these terms!

- Registration, Confirmation & Payment Process: Online registrations will be processed in the order received starting July 5th at 12:00pm. Within 24 hours from the time of submission of your registration you will receive an email indicating that your submission was received and a payment link or that you were waitlisted. There are 80 spots available. Payment is due by July 14th. On July 15th we will send you an email with your class list, a list of what to bring, driving directions, and carpool listings.

- Fishing Licenses: Fishing classes require a valid 2022 Alaska Sport Fishing license. You must bring your license with you.
- **Medical Conditions**: If you have any medical conditions that may limit your ability to participate in these activities, or are pregnant, please consult your physician prior to registration.
- Pets: Pets are <u>NOT</u> permitted.
- Smoking & Drinking: Fish and Game is a smoke-free facility and alcohol is prohibited. Smoking is only permitted in designated locations.

- What to Bring: Classes are outdoors and hands on. For your safety and comfort it is important for you to bring appropriate clothing. Be prepared to dress in layers, including:

Backpacking 101— Ever wanted to start hiking but unsure about what you need? This class will cover, planning your trip, from getting in shape to picking a route and identifying a safety plan. What pack to choose and how to pack it as well as choosing your campsite, setting up tents and crossing creeks! Class will be held inside and outside.

Bear Safety— Learn how to avoid negative encounters with bears, how to interact during a bear encounter, identifying species, evolution & behaviors of bears. This class will be held inside and outside.

Big Game Hunting-Interested in big game hunting in Alaska but not sure where to start? In this class you will learn about choosing a firearm & cartridge, sighting in your firearm, shot placement & anatomy, preparing for the hunt, regulations and more! This class will be held inside.

Bird Watching 101— Learn all about different birds found in interior Water Safety-Pack Raft/Canoe—Different boats for different floats-Alaska with the science educators from the Alaska Songbird Institute! Information will include: birding 101, picking the right binoculars, apps and guides, identification of species, research, banding and more. Participants will go on a short walk and get to join staff to check mist nets for birds. Class is held indoors and outdoors.

Caribou on a Budget— Did you draw a caribou tag this year, or just interested in hunting them? Learn all about locations to hunt, access, budget friendly transportation ideas, what gear to bring, meat care, regulations and more! Class is held indoors and outdoors.

Chainsaw - Learn about chainsaws, safety equipment, and proper techniques needed to safely operate a chainsaw. Learn basic chainsaw maintenance, how to limb trees, cut logs, and stack firewood. Class is held outdoors. Ability to walk 10 mins to class location required.

Dutch Oven - Add the finest in outdoor cuisine to the table in your great Alaskan adventures! Learn to use a Dutch Oven so you are able to cook incredible meals in Alaska's great outdoors. Imagine the aroma of scratch biscuits, fresh bread, and cinnamon rolls wafting thru your campsite. Expand your family's favorite camp meals to include lasagna, salmon pot pie, roasts, sour cream enchiladas, and much more. Top it all off with: pineapple upside down cake, pecan pie, or German chocolate upside down cake! Tasting required! Class is held outdoors.

Fly Fishing 101 - Introduction to the fundamentals of fly fishing, feeding habits of freshwater fish, how a fly rod works, knots and rigging, fly selection, landing fish, regulations and essentials of the cast. Oh-and fishing! Class is held outdoors.

> Lake Fishing 101— For those interested in checking out your nearby lakes! Learn to use an open faced spinning reel, selecting appropriate lures, rigging up, casting, catching and releasing fish, regulations and fishing! Class is held outdoors.

> Plants of the Boreal Forest-Vegetation is the most visible part of our environment. Learn to identify the plants that surround you every day. Learn the major trees, shrubs, and ground cover plants of the boreal forest. We will also discuss their relationship to wildlife habitat, edibility, and other uses as well. Be prepared to spend several hours hiking through varied terrain and habitat. Ability to walk for 10-15 at a time required.

> River Fishing 101— Alaska is home to many rivers. Learn the techniques needed to fish moving water including: overview of gear and tackle set ups, fishing for arctic graying, catch and release, regulations and more! Class is held outdoors.

> Survival 101- This class will give you the basic understanding of how to go safely into the outdoors and survive if things go awry. You will learn about what equipment to bring, how to use it effectively, decision making, situation assessment and basic skills with a map & compass. This class will be held outdoors.

> Upland Bird Hunting— This class will cover information about upland bird hunting with dogs, bird hunting regulations, bird habitat and behavior and more! Class held outdoors.

> Learn the basics of paddling both canoes and pack rafts safely, getting in and out of the boats, paddling and steering techniques, gear and cold water safety.



Taste of the Wild- You have collected your bounty of delicious Alaskan wild fish and game but you don't know what to cook for dinner. Let our instructors inspire you with practical, affordable, healthy delights. Share recipes for cooking game birds, seafood, big game, and other local fare. Tasting required! Class is held indoors.

Wildlife Tracking— Learn who left those tracks! Spend the class identifying wildlife tracks, learning about gaits, scat, browse, and other sign left by creatures big and small. Classroom and field activities. Ability to walk over uneven terrain for a sustained amount of time. Bring a notebook and writing implements.
