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Advisory Announcement

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Undersubscribed Black Bear Drawing Permits Available Hunt DL018: Game Management Unit 1C, South Fall 2020/Spring 2021

(Juneau) – After the recent drawing permit lottery, black bear hunt DL018 (Unit 1C, south of Taku) remains undersubscribed (that is, there were fewer eligible applicants than there are permits). Remaining permits are now available on a first-come, first-served basis. Hunters wishing to apply for a Fall 2020/Spring 2021 DL018 permit should complete the Undersubscribed Hunt Application (attached below) and submit it to the Alaska Department of Fish and Game in Douglas (paul.converse@alaska.gov).

DL018 permits are limited to nonresidents who will not be accompanied either by an Alaska-licensed guide or by a resident relative within the second-degree of kindred. Season dates are September 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. The bag limit is one black bear. A hunter may possess only one undersubscribed black bear permit at a time.

Note that although permits may be awarded immediately after receiving a valid application, they will not be printed and mailed earlier than July.

Application Instructions

You MUST answer questions 1-12, and 17 for the application to be accepted.

Driver's License Number - Enter the state abbreviation and number of your driver's license.

1. Date of Birth <Required>

Enter your date of birth.

Example: MM DD YYYY
November 9, 1968 11 09 1968

2-9. Personal Information <Required>

PRINT your first, middle initial and last name exactly as it appears on your Driver's license. Be sure to include Jr., III, etc. after your last name. Use only capital letters. If there are not enough boxes, continue in the blank space below name.

11. Residency <Required>

Choose one category and place an X in the appropriate box.

- A. Resident:** If you are a current resident or will complete your residency requirement (see below) before the first day of the hunt. **-OR-**
- B. Nonresident:** United States citizen who is not a resident of Alaska.
- Nonresident Alien:** Citizen of a foreign country who is not a resident of the U.S.

Resident: a person (including an alien) who is physically present in Alaska with the intent to remain and make a home here, and who has maintained a domicile in Alaska for the 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the start of the hunt, and who is not claiming residency or obtaining benefits in another state, territory or country. (AS16.05.940(27)).

12. Alaska Hunting License <Required>

Choose one

- A.** Enter your Alaska hunting license number. It can be either the current year's license or next year's license. **-OR-**
- B.** If you are an Alaska resident 10-17 years of age and do not require a hunting license, enter your current age. You must be 10 years old by the starting date of the hunt.

13. Bowhunter Certification Number

You must have obtained your International Bowhunter Education Program (IBEP) certification in order to apply for hunts that have been restricted to bowhunting (archery) only. If you are applying for these hunts, enter your certification number.

14. Muzzleloader Certification Number

You must have obtained your Muzzleloader Certification in order to apply for hunts that have been restricted to Muzzleloaders only. If you are applying for these hunts, enter your certification number.

15. Crossbow Certification Number

You must have obtained your Crossbow Certification in order to apply for hunts that have been restricted to Crossbows only. If you are applying for these hunts, enter your certification number.

ATTENTION NONRESIDENT HUNTERS:

Some nonresident guided hunts require you to have a signed guide-client agreement before or at the time of application. This agreement is available through your guide.

If you apply for one of these hunts (marked in the supplement with the handshake symbol above left) you must write the name of your Alaska-licensed guide (or resident relative within second-degree of kindred) in the box provided, and check the appropriate box to indicate whether this person is a guide or a qualifying relative. If you do not supply this information, your application will be rejected.
