The Department of Law has reviewed the attached regulations of the Board of Fisheries against the statutory standards of the Administrative Procedure Act. Based upon our review, we find no legal problems. This memorandum constitutes the written statement of approval under AS 44.62.060(b) and (c) that authorizes your office to file the attached regulations.

The Department of Fish and Game adopted the regulations after the close of the public comment period. The regulations amend 5 AAC to update various requirements concerning management of salmon fisheries. Notable changes include updates to fisheries location descriptions, setnet standards, commercial fishing seasons and times, and setting optimal escapement goals for salmon in the Chignik area.

Both the September 13, 2022 public notice and the April 13, 2023 order certifying changes state that this action is not expected to require an increased appropriation. Therefore, a fiscal note under AS 44.62.195 is not required.
