

Bristol Bay Salmon Fishery

5 Commercial Fishing Districts

- → Drift and set gillnet gear types.
 - → Drift 150 fathoms 1,863 permits.
 - → Dual drift permits allowed 200 fathoms.
 - Set 50 fathoms 977 permits.
- Drift gillnet registration required in Nushagak and Togiak prior to fishing.
- Registration not required until June 25 in other districts.
- Set gillnet registration required in Nushagak District.
- Permit holders may transfer to new area with 48 hr. wait



Registration Reregistration

- → 14 proposals seeking to modify start dates for district drift registration in east side districts.
- Compromise intended to avoid use of general district.
- Intended to induce fishermen to start fishing earlier and to provide fish to processors earlier in the season in hopes of avoiding limit scenarios.

Nushagak District Set Gillnet Registration


- → 6 stat areas in Nushagak District
- Registration required before fishing
- Remained at request of Stakeholders
- Viewed as protection for fixed gear
- Proposals 42 and 43

Togiak District Registration

- Permit registered can't transfer
- Vessel registered can transfer
- Togiak run is later than rest of Bay
- Togiak run much smaller
- Proposal 44

Permit Stacking

- → 6 proposals (45-50) seeking to allow permit stacking for set gillnets.
 - Permit stacking is currently not allowed with set gillnets. Was allowed 2009-2012.
- → 3 proposals (51-53) seeking to modify regulations for dual drift gillnet operations.
 - Two permit holders fishing from the same vessel may fish an additional 50 fathoms.



Proposals 68 -71

Wood River SHA

Different allocation rules depending on reason for opening.

→ 3 drift to 1 set when protecting Nushagak sockeye.

Combined with district allocation when harvesting surplus Wood River fish.

Togiak Herring

- Population is healthy and sustainable.
- → Price was \$50 per ton in 2015.
- Gillnet effort was record low of 6 in 2015.
- → Purse seine effort was 16 in 2015.
- → Allocation is 30% gillnet 70% seine.
- **→** Proposals 88 − 91.
