Subject: Comments from the Unalaska/Dutch Harbor Advisory Committee meeting held on August 29, 2015 in Unalaska, AK for Proposals included in the Alaska Board Fisheries Alaska Peninsula, Bering Sea/Aleutian Islands/Chignik Pacific Cod meeting November 30, 2015 in Anchorage AK.

Proposal 14 – 5 AAC 28.647 – Aleutian Islands District Pacific Cod Management Plan; and 5 AAC 28.648 Dutch Harbor Sub-district Pacific Cod Management Plan. This proposal was proposed by ADF&G and is in response to the NPFMC 2014 separation of the Aleutian Islands and Bering Sea subareas in order to calculate two separate Pacific Cod GHLs based on the federal ABC in each area.

Discussion: the Unalaska/Dutch Harbor Advisory committee felt that this issue was somewhat a housekeeping issue. Motion to support Proposal 14 made by Good and seconded by Shockley. Motion passed 10/0.

Proposal 15 – 5 AAC 28.648 Dutch Harbor Sub-district Pacific Cod Management Plan. This proposal would expand the Dutch Harbor Subdistrict state waters Pacific Cod fishery boundaries and increase the state waters GHL from 3% to 9% of the federal Bering Sea and Aleutian Islands ABC.

Discussion: the Unalaska/Dutch Harbor Advisory Committee focused concerns on such a sizeable increase in quota, which would go from 18 million pounds to 56 million pounds, in only the second year of this fishery, especially considering that the entire quota is harvested in a very small area. There was also discussion considering that within three miles is the most important nearshore area for Steller sea lions. Increasing the boundary to 170° W long for the state water fishery still leaves outside of three miles, federal waters, closed due to Steller sea lion restrictions. It was also pointed out that there is s lack of observer

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coverage in the under 58' fixed gear fleet. The trawl association representative pointed out the negative impacts to the trawl sector, and to the other large boat sectors, of an increase in the state water fishery.

He also pointed out that the trawlers and others have been supporting Bering Sea communities for over 35 years by delivering cod to local shoreplants, buying fuel, groceries and supporting many local businesses. It was discussed that that if the state-water GHL isn't taken there is no mechanism in place to roll back unharvested cod back to the federal water fishery. Local fishermen on the AC are concerned of an increase in fishery participants with an increase in quota. It is possible that new vessels would come from other communities in Alaska and from other states, putting the local small boat fleet at a major disadvantage. In addition, local fisherman would face shorter seasons. Limited entry may have to be considered for this fishery in the future.

Committee members did not support such a large increase in the GHL but did support the expanded area out to 170° W long., which would spread out the fleet. An amended motion was made by Good and seconded by Shockley. The motion would allow for the increase in the area boundaries to 170° West long., but no increase in GHL percentage. The motion as amended passed 10/0.

Proposal 16 – 5 AAC 28.648 Dutch Harbor Sub district Pacific Cod Management Plan. Increase the GHL for Dutch Harbor subdistrict state-waters Pacific Cod fishery from 3% to a maximum of 7% using a stair-step approach from removals from the Bering Sea Pacific Cod ABC amount. Motion to support made by Shockley and seconded by Good.

Discussion: Similar to the discussion on Proposal 15, increases in GHL couldbring more vessels into the fishery, impacting the local small boat fleet and the larger vessel cod harvesters, who have been delivering to local communities for years. Increases to the GHL inside of state waters may be frowned on by NMFS for potential impacts to Steller sea lions. It was mentioned that items such as trip limits, day light fishing, limited entry and other mechanisms could be put in place including a way to roll back unharvested state-water GHL cod back to the federal water fishery. It was also pointed out that all of the CDQ program cod allocation is harvested and processed by the Freezer Longline catcher-processor fleet to the disadvantage of the 58'< under fleet. Some of the local AC members wanted to support a small increase to the GHL. Discussions lead to an amended motion being made by Mahoney and seconded by Dickerson that would increase the GHL by 4% with no stair-step approach. The amended motion failed 4/5. The main motion to support Proposal 16 also failed 3/6.



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Proposal 17 – 5 AAC 28.648 Dutch Harbor Sub district Pacific Cod Management Plan. Increase the vessel size limit from 58 feet to 125 feet overall length for the Dutch Harbor Subdistrict state-waters Pacific Cod fishery. Motion to support made by Gregory and seconded by Holman.

Discussion: There was no support for Proposal 17 as the Dutch Harbor statewater fishery was intended to be a small boat fishery. The motion to support failed 0/9.

Proposal 18 – 5 AAC 28.647 Aleutian Islands District Pacific Cod Management Plan. Align Aleutian Islands District state waters Pacific Cod season opening and closing dates with recent changes to federal Pacific Cod management. Motion to support made by Good and seconded by Gregory.

Discussion: This was viewed as a housekeeping proposal by ADFG. There were some questions by the longline representative on what triggered the opening and closing dates during the various seasons. Motion to support was approved 8-0.

NOTE: Mahoney briefly left meeting during discussion of this proposal so was unable to vote.

Proposal 19 – 5 AAC 28.647 Aleutian Islands District Pacific Cod Management Plan. Modify vessel size limit for longline vessels in the Aleutian Islands District after September 1 to December 31. If the federal water fishery is closed, this would allow no restriction on the size of vessels using longline gear in the state waters in the Pacific Cod B season based on remaining GHL in the state water fishery. Motion to support was made by Gregory and seconded by Shockley.

Discussion: Committee members were concerned of potential increase in Halibut bycatch if this was allowed for the longline catcher processors to work the statewater B season fishery. It was brought up that in the future there might be an operating shoreside plant that would benefit catcher-vessels that may want to fish during the B season in that area to the benefit of Adak and possibly Atka. Longline harvest representative reminded the committee of the many years of continued stranding of millions of pounds of almost all of the B season state water cod in the Adak area. Motion to support failed 3/6.

Proposal 20 - 5 AAC 28.647 Aleutian Islands District Pacific Cod Management Plan. Define waters between 175 W Long to 178 W Long as the Adak District in the Aleutian Islands District state waters Pacific Cod fishery.



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Discussion: This was proposed by ADF&G and was viewed as a housekeeping type issue. Motion to support made by Shockley and seconded by Good. Motion passed 9/0.

Proposal 21 - 5 AAC 28.647 Aleutian Islands District Pacific Cod Management Plan; and 5 AAC 28.648 Dutch Harbor Sub district Pacific Cod Management Plan. Update state waters Pacific Cod management plans of the Being Sea and Aleutian Islands with current federal references to Steller sea lion protection measures. Motion to support made by Good and seconded by Shockley.

Discussion: This was another proposal by ADFG and was viewed as a housekeeping issue to clarify regulations as it pertains to Sea Lion protection areas. Motion to support made by Good and seconded by Shockley. Motion passed 9/0.

Item 1. ACR Proposals for the Board of Fisheries work session meeting October 21-22 2015 in Anchorage, AK

ACR - 5 AAC 5AAC: 35.506 (i) (2)

Allow the increased retention from 5% to 40% of Tanner Crab in the Bristol Bay Red King Crab fishery Motion to support by Shockley seconded by Goodfellow.

Discussion: ADFG staff no comment, as ADFG staff comments have not been completed. Committee discussion on this proposal showed strong support by all committee members except for one member. The majority felt that changing the percentage of incidentally retained Tanner crab from 5% to 40% in the Bristol Bay Red King Crab fishery would help in reducing unnecessary discards and increased handling mortality of Tanner crab in the Bristol Bay Red Crab fishery. The committee felt that an increase in incidentally retained Tanner crab was also justified by the increase in Eastern Subdistrict Bairdi allocation which would lead to an increase in retention of Tanner Crab. The committee felt that an increase in retention would not become a major problem due to the fact that king crab gear is rigged very differently than Tanner crab pots and it is very easy for Tanner crab to escape from king crab rig gear. The one concern we heard was the impact on processors of unloading and processing of mixed crab species. Motion to support ACR - 5 AAC 5AAC: 35.506 (i) (2) from Alaska Bering Sea Crabbers passed 9-1

ACR - 5 AAC 5AAC: 35.506 (i) (2) Allow the increased retention from 5% to 40% of Snow Crab in the Tanner Crab fishery west of 166° W long. : Motion to support by Shockley seconded by Good

Discussion: ADFG staff no comment, as ADFG staff comments were not completed. Unalaska AC Committee had no problem with this ACR. Discussion on this proposal: it had strong support by all committee members who felt that changing the percentage of incidentally harvested snow crab from 5% to 40% in the Western Subdistrict Tanner crab fishery west of 166° W long. would be a great help in reducing unnecessary discards and increased handling mortality during that fishery. The committee also felt that an increase from 5% to 40% was justified in assisting harvesters to harvest the snow crab allocation, which is currently much larger than the Western Subdistrict Tanner crab fishery. Another factor considered was that the Tanner crab fishery takes place during the winter months and closes on March 31st that area west of 166° W long., during a time of extremely cold temperatures and wind chill factors on the fishing grounds that can cause increase snow crab mortality.

Motion to support ACR - 5 AAC: 35.506 (j) from Alaska Bering Sea Crabbers Passed 10-0.

ACR - 5 AAC 5AAC: 39. 670(c) (3) (D) Allow a vessel in a rationalized crab fishery to deploy crab pot gear for another rationalized target fishery if all of the following criteria are met 1.gear conversion and setting occurs only at the conclusion of the final trip for the previously targeted species prior to offload; 2. Re-rigged and baited gear is hauled within 14 days after setting; 3. Hauling of re-rigged and



baited gear does not occur prior to registering for the new target fishery. Motion to support by Good seconded by Shockley

Discussion: ADFG staff no comment, as ADFG staff comments were not completed. The majority of the board had no problem supporting this ACR. The AC saw this as an economic saving to the harvesters of time, fuel, and extra pot handling. This allows them to go right into another rationalized fishery without having to spend the time and effort removing their gear from the grounds and it increases operating efficiencies. The only member in opposition was worried about Alaska Dept. of Public Safety take of this ACR.

Motion to support ACR - 5 AAC: 39.670 (c) (3) (D) from Alaska Bering Sea Crabbers Passed 9-1.

Item 3. Review and comment on Proposals for Alaska Peninsula /Chignik/Aleutian Island Finfish for the Board of Fisheries meeting February 23-March 1, 2016 in Anchorage, Alaska

Proposal 188 – 5 AAC 12.320 South Alaska Peninsula Salmon Post June Management Plan. Establish open commercial salmon fishing periods in the Unalaska District that coincide with the last two open fishing periods in July in the Shumagin Islands Section. Discussion by committee included the concern that the season would open without surveys being conducted by ADF&G staff. Motion to support made by Good and seconded by Mahoney. Motion failed 0/9.

Proposals 189 through 194 were not addressed by the Unalaska AC.

Proposal 195 – 5 AAC 28.640 Aleutian Islands District and Western District of the South Alaska Peninsula Area Sablefish Management Plan. Update logbook requirements for Aleutian Islands state waters sablefish fishery. This was proposed by ADF&G and was viewed by the Unalaska AC as a housekeeping issue. Motion to support made by Good and seconded by Shockley. Motion passed 9/0.

Proposal 196 – 5 AAC 27.655 Dutch Harbor Food and Bait Herring Fishery. Change the date fishermen using purse seine gear can access the Dutch Harbor food and bait fishery gillnet allocation from July 25^{th} to July 20^{th} . Discussion centered on local entry level gillnet fishermen that may want to fish herring in the Unalaska Bay area, are still interested in this fishery, and may need up to the July 25^{th} date to harvest the gillnet allocation before it is rolled over to the seine fleet. Motion to support made by Mahoney and seconded by Good. Motion failed 1/8.



Proposal 199 – 5 AAC 65.020 Bag Limits, possession limits, annual limits, and size limits for Alaska Peninsula and Aleutian Islands Area. Amend the freshwater bag limit provisions for salmon species (other than King Salmon). Discussion by AC members indicated a concern about local stocks being exploited and possibly over harvested. Motion to support made by Good and seconded by Gregory. Motion failed 3/5 NOTE: Mahoney was excused from the meeting at 2:26 PM before vote occurred.

Proposal 201 - 5 AAC 65.020 Bag Limits, possession limits, annual limits, and size limits for Alaska Peninsula and Aleutian Islands Area. Reduce the possession limit for Coho salmon in Illiuliuk Creek. This was proposed by ADF&G to reduce current possession limits from 4 Coho down to 2 Coho. AC discussion showed great concern about the stock of Coho in Illiuliuk Creek and the amount of sportfish effort on these stocks. An amended proposal was made by Gregory and seconded by Good to reduce bag limits down to 1 Coho per day and possession limits to 1 Coho. The amendment passed 8/0. The main motion as amended passed 8-0

Item 4. Discussion on local area salmon issues, and other items.

Local Salmon fishing at 'Summer's Bay" – The committee read an email from Abi Woodbridge that detailed her concerns and observations at Summers Bay this past June/July 2015. The AC discussed their concerns about the increased number of people fishing at Summer's Bay and possible ways to reduce the impact on the sockeye stocks. Donn Tracy indicated that it would be difficult to issue an emergency order without some type of scientific data that showed a significant impact. This issue will be addressed again at the December Unalaska AC meeting.

Jeff Hancock called the AC's attention to a local issue involving a foot trail being placed in at the Manson Saltry and encouraged public input.

NOTICE OF RESOLUTION BY THE CHIGNIK ADVISORY COMMITTEE (RESOLUTION NO. 2015-001)

To all whom it may concern including the Alaska Board of Fisheries and the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G):

1. The Chignik Advisory Committee (AC) hereby serves notice that it most strongly supports the transfer of Area L salmon management from the Alaska Department of Fish and Game's Westward Region to the department's Central Region. The basis for such is grounded on a multitude of biological, social-economic, and cultural reasons including those specified in the recent Governor's petition calling for the same.

and

2. The Chignik AC also requests that ADF&G manage Chignik's two sockeye runs beginning in 2016 for a minimum escapement of female sockeye salmon in the early run (Black Lake fish) and likewise in the late run (Chignik Lake fish). The Chignik AC findings and those reported by world class fisheries scientist are that best management practices and common logic conforms to ensuring that salmon escapements are managed for an appropriate (minimum) number of females. The targeting of a generic escapement goal, absent of defined criteria for ensuring a specific female component, is unacceptable knowing that in some years too few females return and an overabundance of one-ocean fish and other age males may occur (e.g. 2015) and that salmon reproduction potential is grounded on female fecundity and their abundance.

Lastly, notice is given that the above two requests align with the Alaska Sustainable Fisheries Policy.

I am here to follow your lead, I am still learning.
- VIII. New Business: Tom Hoblet- Since our last P-Cod meeting 3 years ago, Mark do you have the numbers of what was caught inside State waters, in the last 3 years, since we put the proposal in to increase the quota? Mark- Parallel and state waters? Tom-Yes. Mark- 2013 total harvest in parallel and state waters was 25 Million Pounds, or 40.3% of the Western Gulf ABC, in 2014 the harvest was 33.7 million pounds or 46.7% of the Western Gulf ABC, I don't have the 2015, because they are still fishing. I would anticipate they would be in line with these numbers, In the last 10 years, it is right at 45% of the Western Gulf ABC. Low is 37% in 2007 and the high is 54% in 2011. Seems to be in line with your request of proposals 10 and 11.


