I was born and raised in Ketchikan and am a 73 year Resident.

In Wednesdays Ketchikan Daily News 01/10/2018 was an article of Fish and Games considered proposal. It states that one of its justifications is that the fishery is the largest Dungeness fishery in Alaska. It does not say that there are an over abundance of Dungeness crab. So I hope that I am not hearing that the more boats that get in the Dungeness Crab Fishery, the more openings you need???
