

### Southeast Alaska Regional Sport Fish Regulations

- King salmon fishing is closed in fresh waters of Southeast Alaska (except Yakutat Area).
- Bait is allowed in fresh water September 15 –
  November 15.
- Sport fishing may be conducted only by the use of a single line per angler, and not more than six lines may be fished from a vessel.
- The maximum number of fishing lines that may be fished from a vessel engaged in sport fishing charter activities is equal to the number of paying clients on board the vessel.
- The king salmon, demersal shelf rockfish, and lingcod sport fisheries are managed for allocations.

### Tools for Estimating Sport Fish Harvest

### • Statewide Harvest Survey- mailed survey

 Comprehensive and includes responses from a large number of respondents. However, data is not available until one year after season.


### Southeast Marine Boat Harvest Study- creel

 Provides inseason information and collects biological samples (including CWT's and genetic samples).


### Charter logbooks

- Very detailed information recorded for every charter trip.
- Electronic reporting became mandatory as of 2021.


# Southeast Alaska and Statewide Effort Average Angler-days 2011-2020




# Southeast Alaska Sport Fishery Effort by Residency – Angler-days 1996-2020





# Changes to the Pacific Salmon Treaty and the King Salmon Management Plan

- Renegotiated Pacific Salmon Treaty for 2019-2028
- King Salmon Management Plan required changes to remain within the sport allocation
- Out of cycle action taken by the board in 2019:
  - Modified management tiers to account for the reduction in Alaska's share of the coastwide catch limit
  - Guidance for inseason management within 3 tiers
  - Included increased bag/possession limits for resident anglers in inside waters when they reopen after being closed for conservation
  - Language updated to reference the winter troll CPUE rather than the outdated abundance index

# Southeast Alaska King Salmon Management Plan - Objectives

- 1. Attain an average harvest of 20% of the annual all gear catch limit (after subtracting the commercial net fisheries allocation).
- 2. Allow uninterrupted marine sport fishing for king salmon, while not exceeding the sport fishery allocation.
- 3. Minimize restrictions on residents.
- 4. Provide stability to the sport fishery by eliminating inseason regulatory changes, except those needed for conservation.

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


- Various combinations of bag, possession, annual, limits, and nonretention periods to achieve the sport allocation.






### Southeast Alaska PST king salmon allocation and harvest
