Miscellaneous Business:

1. **Draft subsistence guide definition proposal**: The board reviewed a draft proposal to establish a statewide subsistence guide definition as provided in RC25. If the board generated the



proposal it would be submitted as a proposal for the 2023 Statewide Finfish meeting. The board failed the proposal by a vote of 2/4.

- 2. Fire Creek Pike Eradication with Rotenone and 3-Year Preauthorization: The board approved the Division of Sport Fish's use of rotenone in the Fire Creek Pike Eradication Project as described in RC70. The board also approved the department's use of rotenone through December 2024 in rapid response situations for any newly discovered northern pike populations that threaten uninvaded drainages and require immediate action.
- 3. Update on the Board's Crab Observer Oversight Task Force: Executive Director Haight noted the board's policy 2020-298-FB which reauthorized the Crab Observer Oversight Task Force through 2024. When written, the reauthorization anticipated a Tanner crab subjects to occur in March 2024. However, due to meeting delays caused by COVID-19 the next Tanner crab meeting will occur in 2025. Haight indicated the board can address this date issue at the upcoming October work session.
- 4. The board provided closing remarks with Members Payton and Godfrey serving in their last year.
