I support of Proposal 36;

- 100' is enough rope to operate safely and efficiently. When it's rough, it's already long enough to stretch and absorb wave surge on the net. You can safely maneuver a 32' foot boat. I own a 32' stern picker boat. I can easily switch ends of net, and tow in and out of sand bars and shallow sets. 100' is enough towline. Mine is 50' long.

I support of Proposal 29:

- I support the amendments made by the Togiak AC. I started fishing for myself in the Togiak River in 1968. I lived in Togiak until the late 1970's. The kings are not there in the way they used to be. It could be a result of longlining. I live in Manokotak now, and fish the Nushagak District. The Togiak Kings are the same as the Nushagak King Salmon. They are getting less and less and much smaller. It's the same for Togiak.

I support Proposal 48:

- Togiak is very small. The fishery is balanced with small boats fishing. It has taken a long time to balance it this way. It's not going to compete with big boats coming to the bay.
