#### Miscellaneous Business:

The board discussed four items under the Miscellaneous Business section of there agenda:

- 1. Board member Zuray will work with Executive Director Nelson to draft a letter requesting the Alaska Legislature to authorize the use of electronic monitoring for the purposes of fishery observation. <u>RC 102</u> contained some of the possible elements of this letter. A draft letter will be brought back to the board at a future meeting for possible approval.
- 2. Commissioner Vincent-Lang provided a draft delegation of authority (<u>RC 140</u>) to the board that would create a new discretionary exemption on the importation and release of live fish to stock lakes.



- 3. The board voted (by a vote of 4-2, with one absent) to only accept proposals to limit or reduce egg takes for hatchery production during the meeting cycle for statewide finfish. Statewide finfish is in the 2025/2026 meeting cycle.
- 4. Board member Godfrey will work with Executive Director Nelson to draft a policy for remote participation by board members for board meetings. A draft will be brought forward at a future meeting for possible approval.

The meeting adjourned at 4:30 p.m. on Sunday, December 15.
