# Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation & Management Act and State Fisheries Management

## Magnuson-Stevens Act

- Principal law governing marine fisheries in the U.S.
- Applicable to all fisheries in the EEZ (3-200 NM)
  - Does not apply to State waters (0-3 NM), which includes all internal waters of PWS and SEAK
- Requires management to be consistent with several provisions, including 10 national standards
- Alaska has delegated management authority for some fisheries (i.e., SEAK salmon, BSAI crab)

#### **MSA-State Jurisdiction**

Section 306 (3): A State may regulate a fishing vessel outside the boundaries of the State in the following circumstances:

- (A) The fishing vessel is registered under the law of that State, and
- (i) **there is no FMP** or other applicable Federal fishing regulations for the fishery in which the vessel is operating; or
- (ii) the **State's laws and regulations are consistent with the FMP and applicable Federal fishing regulations** for the fishery in which the vessel is operating.
- (B) The FMP for the fishery in which the fishing vessel is operating delegates management of the fishery to a State and the State's laws and regulations are consistent with such FMP...

# MSA National Standard 4: Allocations

Conservation and management measures shall not discriminate between residents of different states.

If it becomes necessary to allocate or assign fishing privileges among various United States fishermen, such allocation shall be (a) fair and equitable to all such fishermen; (b) reasonably calculated to promote conservation; and (c) carried out in such manner that no particular individual, corporation, or other entity acquires an excessive share of such privilege.

### **MSA Groundfish Proposals**

- 105 Modify sport fishing regulations in salt waters subject to the MSA by removing differential regulations for resident & nonresident anglers
- 198 Increase the sport fish resident bag limit for sablefish
- 203 Establish unguided nonresident lingcod regulations in the sport fishery
- 206 Reopen yelloweye sport fishery for residents
- 207 Allow retention of demersal shelf rockfish by nonresidents
- 208 Allow retention of demersal shelf rockfish by nonresidents
- 209- Establish provisions for a resident priority within emergency order authority for pelagic rockfish

# **Key Points**

- It is in Alaska's best interest to comply with MSA to retain the ability to manage fisheries in the EEZ
- In federal waters, non-resident and resident limits must be the same
  - Applies to sport, personal use, & subsistence
- The Board may continue to provide a priority for residents in state waters
