

 - provide opportunity to take large grizzlies








Brown Bear

- Harvestable surplus 23 bears.
 - Uncertainty in the estimate.
- Risk of overharvest is high.





CUA

- RM640 moose permits
 - 1,031 permits in 2004
 - 1,086 permits in 2005
- 57% of all permits went to unit 18 hunters and 39% went to Unit 19A hunters
- Approximately 82% of permittees hunted

CUA

Important Points to Consider

1. The board endorsed the CKMMP in 2004

- This CUA was identified as a key regulation in the plan
- 2. User conflicts were common prior to the CUA
- 3. The Board failed similar proposals in 1994 and 2008
- Ongoing wolf control and bear control in 2013 and 2014





Caribou Management in Units 19A&B

- Considered part of the Mulchatna Caribou Herd
- Included with Units 17 & 9 (A,B, and a portion of C)
- Managed under registration permit RC503
- Generally managed under a consistent management strategy

Mulchatna Caribou Hunt Regulations


Current regulations:

Mulchatna Caribou 17 and 9B 18, 19A&B, and 9B&C (Alaska resident season only) (2 caribou by registration permit-RC503)

Season dates Aug 1–Mar 31 Aug 1–Mar 15

Proposed new regulation: 18, 19A, and 19B (Nonresident season) (1 bull by drawing permit-up to 50 permits)

Sep 1–Sep 30




Caribou / Units 19A&B

Recent history on nonresident season

- Closed throughout Mulchatna range in RY2009
- Proposals by concerned parties emphasizing low bull-to-cow ratios and declining population led to closure
- Department position was neutral due to the allocative nature of these proposals

- Area: GMUs 9B, 17B&C, 19A&B
- Purpose: To increase the Mulchatna Caribou Herd to aid in achieving intensive management objectives
- Active Wolf Control

Discussion

- Most IM objectives not being met
- ANS of 2,100–2,400 not being met
- Harvestable surplus of ~1,200 would not provide for ANS
- Reported harvest is far below surplus
- Access not abundance is limiting harvest
