

Public Proposal

Effect of Proposal :

Beginning July 1, 2018, all hunters 12 years of age or older must have completed a hunter education course to hunt in the state of Alaska. Hunters under 12 years of age must be accompanied by someone who has successfully completed a hunter education course.

Recommendation : The department is NEUTRAL on this proposal.

- Hunter education was established in Alaska in 1973 and since then over 50,000 students have received their hunter education certification.
- Bowhunter education, muzzleloader education, and crossbow education have also become part of the certification courses offered by the ADF&G Hunter Information and Training (HIT) Program.

- Prior to August 2002, the hunter education certification was not required for hunters wishing to hunt in Alaska, except for those using the
 - -Anchorage Coastal Wildlife Refuge
 - -Mendenhall Wetlands State Game Refuge
 - -Eagle River Management Area (black bear and small game)

 In 1997, the Alaska Board of Game (BOG) passed regulations requiring hunter education certification for big game hunting in Game Management Units (GMUs) 7, 13, 14, 15, and 20. These regulations took effect in August 2002.

Here is a guestimate of how much it would cost for one year to implement mandatory hunter ed statewide for people that are 12 years old or older.

- While the department is in favor of certification courses to educate hunters and decrease firearm incidents, the sheer size of Alaska would make it extremely difficult to reach every hunter 12 years of age or older.
- Should this proposal be adopted, the department recommends that implementation be postponed for +2 years
